

## **PART 3 - SECTION 2 - RESPONSIBILITY FOR LOCAL CHOICE FUNCTIONS**

**This table has been compiled in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 3(1) of, and Schedule 2 of the Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended ("the Regulations"). Schedule 2 to the Regulations lists those "functions which may be (but need not be) the responsibility of an authority's executive", otherwise known as "Local Choice Functions". The Council has decided that these functions should be the responsibility of the responsible body listed below**

1 Any function under a Local Act, other than those functions which are "not to be the responsibility of the executive" by virtue of the Regulations.	Regulation Committee
2 The determination of an appeal against any decision made by or on behalf of the authority.	Ad hoc Committee of 5 or 3 convened by the Chief Executive and drawn by him/her from the membership of the Regulation Committee
3 Any function relating to the submission of a petition for a Mayoral Referendum and the procedures relating to the delivery of a Mayoral Referendum and election	The Chief Executive
4 Making arrangements for appeals against exclusion of pupils.	The Assistant Director – Legal, Governance and Elections
5 Making arrangements for school admission appeals.	The Assistant Director – Legal, Governance and Elections
6 Making arrangements for appeals by governing bodies.	The Assistant Director – Legal, Governance and Elections
7 Making arrangements for enabling questions to be put, at council meetings, on the discharge of the functions of all joint authorities.	Council
8 Making appointments of Council Members to police authorities.	Council

9 Any function relating to contaminated land.	The Executive.
10 The discharge of any function relating to the control of pollution or the management of air quality.	The Executive and the Director - Environment.
11 The service of an abatement notice in respect of a statutory nuisance.	The Executive and the Director - Environment
12 The passing of a resolution that Schedule 2 to the Noise and Statutory Nuisance Act 1993 should apply in the Authority's area.	Regulation Committee
13 The inspection of the authority's area to detect statutory nuisance.	Regulation Committee and the Director - Environment
14 The investigation of any complaint as to the existence of a statutory nuisance.	Regulation Committee and the Director - Environment
15 Obtaining information under Section 330 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as to interests in land.	Planning Committee, the Director - Places and the Assistant Director – Legal, Governance and Elections
16 Obtaining particulars of persons interested in land under Section 16 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.	Planning Committee, Regulation Committee, the Directors – Place /Environment and the Assistant Director – Legal, Governance and Elections
17 Making agreements for the execution of highway works.	The Executive and the Director - Place
18 The appointment of any individual : (a) to any office other than an office in which he is employed by the authority;	Council/Cabinet
